Thank you all so much for completing our parent questionnaires, it's so useful for us to receive your feedback and we always try to improve our service however we can, taking into account your suggestions and comments. One thing I did want to mention which came up on the questionnaires was our shift patterns. In order to maintain ratios, our shifts start anytime from 7.45am and finish anytime from 4.15pm. Some staff work long days (7.45am - 6.00pm) (Tasha, Nina, Julie, Terri, Vikki, Paul, Charlotte) whilst others are on the different shift patterns which change each week. This means that you may not see your child's key person on drop off or collection on some days but please rest assured that our team work hard to ensure communication between all staff within the rooms is excellent and that your key person will be carrying out all of your child's planning and assessment each week even if you don't see them. Shifts are rotated each

week where possible to try and ensure contact between the key person and parents at some point over the course of the week, but please feel free to communicate via e-mail, Learning Journals and your child's communication book too. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask.

Communication Books

Please please can we ask that all parents/carers complete your child's communication book each week, letting us know what your child has been up to during the weekend and time at home with family members. This is a hugely important tool for engaging your child in discussions linking home life with nursery life and I can assure you that the children all look forward to sharing their news with their key person and peers every week. You don't have to write much, just a couple of sentences (or more if you want to) and if you don't have time to complete please could you just initial your key person's comments to let them know you have seen these as it's an important tool we use to share information with parents.

We would also encourage you to comment on your child's observations on Learning Journals when possible - when you login to see your child's observations you will see a section where you can make a parent comment - feel free to add any comments here, eg. 'We have been working on this at home' or 'My child loved talking about this' or anything else that you feel is relevant. Please ask if you need any help with this.



Foodbank News

We would like to thank everyone for such kindness with your Foodbank donations recently, everything was gratefully received and passed to local families in need via the Wellspring.

One of our lovely parents has suggested that we could continue with this kindness and help people in our local area who are in need. The Wellspring organisation is a local charity who provides services to homeless and disadvantaged people 365 days per year. Their aim is to support people out of homelessness and to become independent of services. We have spoken to them to see how we can best help at this time of year and they have provided us with a list of items which are always in high demand so we have decided to collect 1 item each week at nursery for the next 11 weeks which we thought would make it easy for parents to simply donate 1 item each week if you would like to help. After the 11 weeks we will be in touch to see how we can help disadvantaged people over the Christmas period (we are thinking of possibly asking for toy donations to help local families in need but will get back to you nearer the time).

I am planning to send out a reminder e-mail each week to let you know which item we are collecting for that week and if you would like to help to just bring that item in and pop it in the box in the hall. We will be asking for the following items:

Outdoor Play
