## November 2020

We hope everyone is well and in good spirits despite the difficulties we have all faced during our second national lockdown. We are pleased to report that we have all been continuing life at nursery with our usual amount of fun, laughter and adventure during the past month and our staff have been wrapping everybody up in warm clothing to enjoy our outdoor play time each day.

Thank you to all of our families for your support and donations during Children In Need Week, the children loved this theme and participated in many different activities across the nursery. We were also extremely grateful for everyone's support for Prematurity Awareness day which was celebrated throughout the nursery to help raise awareness and raise money for a fanatic local charity very close to our hearts. Our rooms were filled with pink and purple all day!

We have also received confirmation from Stockport council that schools will be closing earlier than expected for the Christmas holidays and completing 2 days of home learning before the start of the Christmas holidays. Nurseries are **not** included in this planned closure so we will be operating as normal during the festive period and only closing for the Bank Holidays as follows:

Tuesday December 29th: Wednesday 30th: Open 8.00am - 5.45pm Thursday December 31st: 8.00am - **4.00pm (New Year's Eve)** 

Friday 1st January: Nursery Closed (Bank Holiday) Monday 4th January onwards: Normal operating hours 8.00am - 5.45pm

We are currently arranging our staffing for Christmas week and due to the earlier school closures this has been more complicated than usual so we are unfortunately unable to accommodate any requests for children to swap sessions during this period. Much as we like to accommodate our families' requests where possible, this year we find ourselves in a very different situation so we are grateful for your understanding with this. We continue to follow all of our stringent risk assessments for Covid-19 to keep everybody as safe as possible to be in a position to enjoy some down time with their families over Christmas.

Christmas preparations have started at nursery and our team of Elves have already been very busy preparing the nursery for December! You will have seen decorations starting to pop up on our photographs on Facebook and we have painted the whole interior of the building which has given everywhere a lovely fresh environment to begin our festive decorating. Christmas is such a magical time for children and one of our absolute favourite times of year. Rest assured we will all be full of festive cheer, excitement and magic and although things may be a little different this year we are working very hard behind the scenes to ensure your child enjoys this special time.

Our Pre-School team are disappointed that we can't go on our annual Pantomime trip this year to Stockport Plaza so instead they have written their own pantomime and are currently rehearsing this so that it will be ready to perform for the children on Wednesday 16th December. All of the staff have started to sing Christmas songs with the children across all of the rooms and we have our Christmas jumper day planned for 11th December, Christmas dinner day for 18th December and Christmas party day on 21st December. Children are encouraged to come to nursery dressed in Christmassy clothes for these special days if they would like to and there will be lots of activities going on throughout the day.
